The awards are offered annually to a municipality or regional district implementing a project or program best integrating energy /climate planning into community or corporate planning and development processes. Awards are offered in three categories:

- 1. Community Planning and Development**
- 2. Corporate Operations**
- 3. Public Sector Organization & Local Government Partnerships**

Recognition

All applications are recognized in CEA publications and on CEA's website. A winner is selected for each category. Honourable mentions are selected at the discretion of the independent judging committee.

Recipients receive:

- a trophy and/or plaque,
- a copy of the news release,
- recognition at the Union of BC Municipalities Convention,
- a presentation to Council or Board, and
- one year free CEA membership.

Eligibility

All BC municipalities and regional districts are encouraged to apply. Winners come from all sizes of communities — leadership shown and challenges overcome are key judging criteria.

Judging criteria for each category include:

- **Energy & climate action**
- **Demonstrated community leadership**
- **Measured impact and cost effectiveness**
- **Best practices and innovation**
- **Collaboration with BC public sector organizations**

The **2014 Climate & Energy Action Awards** were presented by MLA Linda Reimer, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Community, Sport and Cultural Development, at the Union of BC Municipalities Convention in Whistler.

Richmond won in the **Community Planning and Development** category for the Alexandra District Geothermal Energy Utility and **Nanaimo** won in the **Corporate Operations** category for the energy recovery facility constructed as part of a new water supply system.

Telkwa won the **Public Sector Collaboration** award for a biomass district energy partnership with School District 54.

Honourable Mentions were awarded to:

- **Campbell River** for Power Down Campbell River & **Metro Vancouver** for Charging up the Region
- **Saanich** for its Fuel Efficient Municipal Fleet and **Sparwood** for its Leisure Centre Energy Retrofit
