The Community Energy Association (CEA), Ministry of Community, Sport and Cultural Development, BC Hydro, FortisBC and Union of BC Municipalities are pleased to invite all local governments in British Columbia to participate in the **2016 Climate & Energy Action Awards**.

The awards are offered annually to a municipality or regional district implementing a project or program best integrating energy /climate planning into community or corporate planning and development processes. Awards are offered in three categories:

- 1. Community Planning and Development**
- 2. Corporate Operations**
- 3. Public Sector Organization & Local Government Partnerships**

## Recognition

All applications are recognized in CEA publications and on CEA's website. A winner is selected for each category. Honourable mentions are selected at the discretion of the independent judging committee.

Recipients receive:

- a trophy and/or plaque,
- a copy of the news release,
- Awards ceremony and presentation by a Provincial Minister at the Union of BC Municipalities Convention,
- a presentation to Council or Board, and
- one year free CEA membership.

## Eligibility

All BC municipalities and regional districts are encouraged to apply. Winners come from all sizes of communities — leadership shown and challenges overcome are key judging criteria.

## Criteria

Judging criteria for each category include:

- **Energy & climate action**
- **Energy excellence in the built environment**
- **Demonstrated community leadership**
- **Measured impact and cost effectiveness**
- **Best practices and innovation**
- **Collaboration with BC public sector organizations**

## 2015 Climate & Energy Action Award Winners

The **2015 Climate & Energy Action Awards** were presented by the **Honourable Mary Polak, Minister of Environment** at the Union of BC Municipalities Convention in Vancouver.

**North Cowichan** won in the **Community Planning and Development** category for the University Village Sustainable Local Area Plan.



**Prince George** won in the **Corporate Operations** category for the energy efficient LEED RCMP facility.

**An Honourable Mention** was awarded to **Richmond** for reducing GHG emissions at the Richmond Ice Centre by 26%.



**An Honourable Mention** was awarded to **Qualicum Beach** for a new Fire Hall that reduces GHG emissions by 72%.

The awards ceremony was also attended by Darrell Mussatto, Mayor of the City of North Vancouver (CEA Chair) and award co-sponsor representatives Brian Bedford (Director of Local Government Infrastructure and Engineering, Ministry of Community, Sport and Cultural Development); Siraz Dalmir (Key Account Manager Local Government, Fortis BC); and Lawrence Pillon (Community Relations, BC Hydro).
