Each listing of a specific funding program includes the program title, description, eligibility criteria, available funding, application deadlines, and funding organization with contact information and website address.

The guide is organized alphabetically by funding organization and program name. Each program has been categorized according to its focus area: buildings, infrastructure, renewable energy and transportation. Some programs are applicable to more than one category. The cross-reference table at the beginning of the guide enables quick identification of programs within categories and types of incentives available.

# CEA FUNDING GUIDE

## Local Government Funding Program

1. BC Bioenergy Network – Funding Programs		Category: Renewables
<b>Description</b> <p>BC Bioenergy Network financially supports pilot and full-scale technology development as well as demonstration bioenergy capital projects. Projects should meet the following criteria: 1) significant environment benefits particularly lower GHG emissions; 2) innovative technologies (best in class or first time); 3) pilot or full-scale commercial facilities; 4) potential to be replicated in BC and/or export markets; 5) regional diversity; and 6) partnerships with private and public sector stakeholders.</p> <p>In addition, BCBN provides financial assistance to enable communities and companies to develop the skills and knowledge needed to implement bioenergy initiatives. The network has supported capacity building projects related to biomass availability studies, planning and technical feasibility studies, and more.</p>		
<b>Application Dates</b> <p>No specific application deadlines. Contact BCBN directly.</p>	<b>Funding Available</b> <p>Capital projects: 10-30% of project costs. Loans are provided for projects with lower commercial risk and higher expected returns. 2. BC Housing – Building Excellence Research & Education Grants Program		Category: Buildings
<b>Description</b> <p>This grant program supports innovative research and education initiatives that enhance the quality of residential construction and strengthen consumer protection for buyers of new homes. Industry and consumer organizations, researchers and education providers are eligible to apply. Local governments qualify as educators or researchers depending on the nature of the project.</p>		
<b>Application Dates</b> <p>The 2020 application deadline has past. ### 3. BC Hydro – Business Energy Saving Incentives

Category: Buildings

#### Description

Financial incentives are available to replace inefficient products with energy-efficient technologies. They are offered for lighting, heating, ventilation, air conditioning, and refrigeration. Commercial customers and local governments can apply for these incentives.

#### Application Dates

Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis.

#### Funding Available

Varies but incentives on average cover about 25% of energy efficiency upgrades. They could fund up to 75% of costs. Incentives depend on hours of operation, energy savings, project cost and payback period.

### 4. BC Hydro – Residential New Construction Program

Category: Buildings

#### Description

The Residential New Construction Program is offering BC Energy Step Code Implementation funding for local governments in BC Hydro's service area. Funding shall be allocated to provide incentives and/or rebates to residential builders to work with a licensed energy advisor for design modelling, performance testing and completion of EnerGuide rating for new residential construction. To qualify, local governments must have a council approved adoption timeline of BC Energy Step Code Step 1 or higher for Part 9 residential new construction within 6 months to 2 years of BC Building Code enforcement (December 15, 2017). In addition, they need to commit to the following actions: participation of a building official in quarterly meetings to share info on the Energy Step Code implementation process and co-promotion of builder education and training on the Energy Step Code in or near their community. Applications are due by February 2, 2018. Email BC Hydro for an application form.

Up to \$20,000 for eligible local governments with city-wide Energy Step Code regulations for new [Part 9 buildings](#).

## 5. BC Hydro - Sustainable Communities Program

Category: All

### Description

Local governments can exercise influence over energy use in a community through land use controls, bylaws, regulations and compliance tools. The Sustainable Communities Program provides financial support and technical guidance to local governments to encourage them to use the specific powers available to them in order to embed energy conservation and efficiency into community planning and development, support the adoption of new building codes and standards, drive building energy retrofits, and advance low carbon electrification initiatives. Program offers are available to support the following:

- Planning – Funding to develop and implement Community Energy and Emissions Plans (CEEPs) and to embed consideration for energy in other municipal plans and planning processes.
- People – Salary support for Community Energy Managers (CEMs), Interns and UBC Sustainability Scholars

Local governments with more than 75,000 residents and champion local governments (those with over 20,000 residents, a Council-approved CEEP and demonstrated leadership in demand side management) in the BC Hydro service territory are eligible to apply. Local governments with fewer than 20,000 residents are eligible for the QuickStart Program, which supports the development of Community Energy and Emissions Plans and provides coaching and peer support for ongoing CEEP implementation activities.

### Application Dates

CEEP, Planning, CEM, Intern and QuickStart funding are available on an ongoing basis. Internship, Co-op Student assistance is offered once annually. Local governments should consult their Key Account Manager to obtain an application form.

### Funding Available

CEEP: Up to 50% of costs to a maximum of \$60,000.  
 Community plans: Up to \$20,000 per plan.  
 CEM: Up to 50% of salary to a maximum of \$50,000 per year for two years.  
 Interns: Up to 50% of salary to a maximum of \$7,000 per 4 month term.  
 QuickStart: The Community Energy Association will deliver a CEEP webinar and workshop, develop the CEEP and provide coaching and peer network support for implementation.

## 6. Bullitt Foundation – Grant Programs

Category: All

### Description

This foundation funds projects in the Pacific Northwest Emerald Corridor that achieve positive environment impacts. Projects must fall within five program areas: energy, climate and materials; deep green buildings; resilient cities and healthy communities; regional ecosystem health; and thought leadership and innovation. Priority is given to projects fostering sustainability in Metro Vancouver, Seattle and Portland. Non-profit organizations with charitable status are eligible to apply. Local governments would need to partner with non-profit entities.

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<h2>7. Columbia Basin Trust - Grant Programs</h2>	<p><b>Category: All</b></p>
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**Description**

Columbia Basin Trust (CBT) offers a variety of funding programs, three of which are most pertinent for energy and infrastructure initiatives. Local governments and indigenous organizations within the Columbia River watershed are eligible to apply.

Community Development Program Grants support projects that address community challenges and opportunities in the region, such as construction or renovation of community facilities/capital assets and community based research and planning (e.g. feasibility studies, community planning processes). Recreation & Physical Activity Grants fund new construction or upgrades to current recreation infrastructure such as sport and recreation facilities, trails and greenways, and capital projects that foster active transportation. Environment Grants fund initiatives that address one of four areas: 1) conserve ecosystems/species of concern and reduce the threat of invasive species to ecosystems; 2) adapt to climate change impacts or lower GHG emissions; 3) protect or restore water resources that are vital to ecosystems/species of concern and conduct water quality/quantity research; and 4) educate residents about the natural environment.

<p><b>Application Dates</b></p> <p>Community Development &amp; Recreation Infrastructure Grants: Contact CBT to discuss the project. Selected projects will be forwarded an application. The deadline for Recreation Infrastructure applications is February 1, 2018. There is no specific timeline for the Community Development Program.</p> <p>Environment Grants: Applications are being accepted for small grants until February 28, 2018. 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## 8. Environment & Climate Change Canada - EcoAction Community Funding Program

Category: All

### Description

Environment & Climate Change Canada's EcoAction program supports projects that have positive impacts on the environment and involve community members. Projects should address one of four themes: clean air, climate change, clean water or nature. They also need to meet these additional core requirements: 1) include a minimum of one key environmental indicator; 2) feature actions offering tangible results in project time frame; 3) have potential for self-sustaining continuity once program support ends; and 4) align with provincial and/or municipal bylaws. Aboriginal organizations are eligible for funding. Municipal governments are *only eligible* if they partner with a non-profit organization on a project proposal.

### Application Dates

Call for proposals for projects in 2019-2020 is closed. Please refer to the ECC website for the 2021 deadline.

### Funding Available

Up to 50% of total project costs and a maximum of \$100,000. The remaining costs need to come from sources besides the federal government.

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## 12. FortisBC – Climate Action Partners Program

Category: All

### Description

FortisBC’s Climate Action Partners program offers capacity to help local governments, indigenous communities and other organizations achieve their climate action goals and while making progress toward FortisBC’s 30BY30 climate commitment. The program funds a Senior Energy Specialist (SES) role, a designated team resource dedicated to applying FortisBC’s suite of low carbon and renewable energy solutions such as corporate and community energy efficiency, low and zero carbon transportation, and renewable gas to help achieve the organization’s climate action goals.

## 15. FortisBC - Custom Energy Efficiency Programs for Existing Buildings (Natural Gas & Electricity)

## 27. Ministry of Energy, Mines & Petroleum Resources – Go Electric Incentive Program

## 6. Ministry of Energy, Mines & Petroleum Resources – SCRAP-IT Program

Category: Transportation

### Description

This program provides incentives to vehicle owners to replace their older, higher emission vehicle with more sustainable modes of transportation. An electric vehicle incentive is one of four types of incentives provided. This incentive may be combined with those offered through the Clean Energy for BC Program. Other incentives pertain to electric bikes and scooters, transit passes, car sharing memberships, and cash.

Local governments may wish to promote these opportunities to citizens.

Continuous intake of applications. Submit online application form.

EV: \$6,000 for new vehicle or \$3,000 for used vehicle.

## Steps to a Winning Grant Application

### Preparing an Application

1. Review Community Energy Association's ***Funding your Community Energy and Climate Change Initiatives*** or other funding guides to determine if programs are available to support your project.
2. Ensure a good fit. Check your project's goals and objectives against those of the funding program. Review evaluation criteria and ensure that your proposal responds directly to each, or as many as possible.
3. Contact funding agency. Describe your project and ask:
  - Does this project meet the funding program's goals and objectives?
  - What are key elements of past successful applications?
  - What are the evaluation criteria (if not listed on form)?
  - Can supporting material (such as letters of support) be submitted after the closing date?
  - Are previous applications available for review?
  - Is Council or Board endorsement of the application required?
4. Create a timeline for application preparation and an application package checklist, including:
  - Obtaining executive committee, Council or Board endorsement, if required
  - Identifying and/or obtaining supporting funding
  - Identifying possible partners and reaching agreements
  - Writing the proposal and ensuring senior management review and final edits
  - Securing letters of support
  - Developing a budget
  - Copying and filing
  - Submission deadline, format and method of delivery (postmarked document, email, etc.)
5. Review application package checklist and ensure that all requirements have been met.
6. Submit proposal on time in the required format.

### Application Content

1. Follow the recommended format of proposal.
2. Focus on key elements and ensure that you clearly address evaluation criteria. Include everything you think is important, but be succinct – longer is not better.
3. List resources your agency has committed or will commit to ensure success of project.
4. Identify partners and note how will you work with them to ensure success.
5. Describe any planned community engagement processes, if required. Consider using innovative approaches.
6. Facts and figures are helpful. If possible, calculate or estimate magnitude of benefits of the project.
7. A budget can be either calculated or estimated but it should not necessarily reflect the maximum amount of funding available, unless you can justify it. Provide a reasonable level of detail for costs, itemize matching funds, and mention in-kind contributions, if any.
