

CleanBC Communities Fund 2

Application Deadline: November 12, 2020 (11:59pm PST)

The second intake for the CleanBC Communities Fund is now underway. The following entities may apply, at the associated government funding contribution levels. Note that funding contributions are paid on a reimbursement basis only.

	<i>Federal</i>	<i>Provincial</i>	<i>Overall</i>
<i>Local Government</i>	40%	33.33%	73.33%
<i>Indigenous (On-Reserve)</i>	75%	15%	90%
<i>Indigenous (Off-Reserve)</i>	75%	0%	75%
<i>Not-for-Profit</i>	40%	25%	65%
<i>For-Profit</i>	25%	15%	40%



What can CEA help with?

CEA has funding from the Province of BC to complete a **minimum of five (5) Preliminary GHG Assessments for remote, rural, and indigenous communities**. If you believe you qualify, contact us at info@communityenergy.bc.ca to inquire about how we can help you with your GHG Assessment!

What projects qualify?

Projects* must fall into one of 4 categories:

- **Increased capacity to manage renewable energy**
E.g. Battery storage, HVDC cables for renewables
- **Increased access to clean energy transportation**
E.g. EV charging station networks, hydrogen refuelling station networks
- **Increased energy efficiency of buildings**
E.g. Building envelope upgrades, heat pump installations
- **Increased generation of clean energy**
E.g. Waste heat recovery, biomass

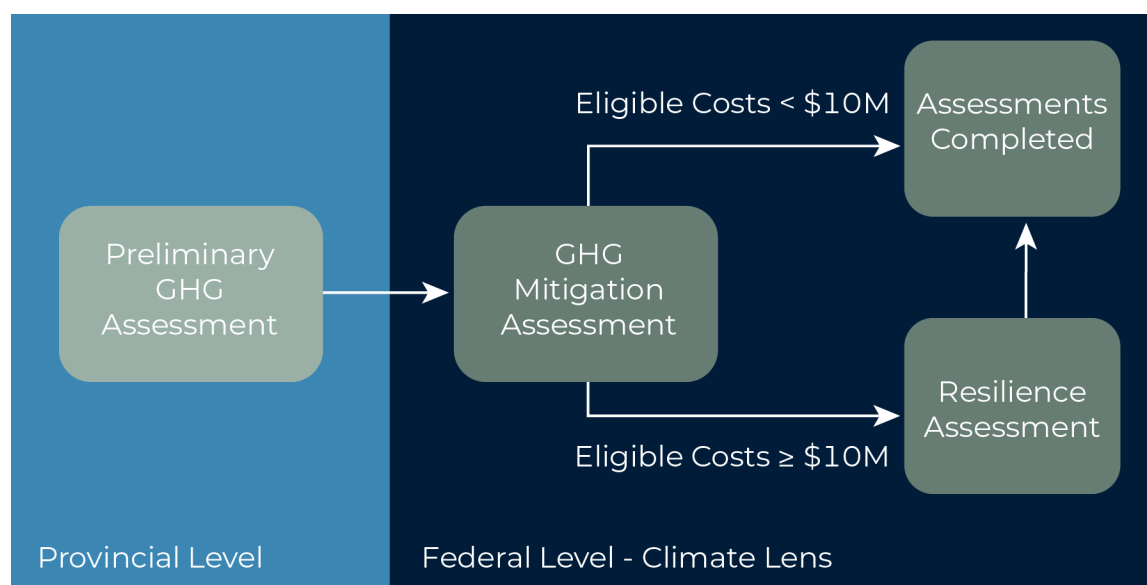
* All projects must be for **public use and benefit** (e.g. no corporate buildings)

What's needed?

- A **Business BCeID** (to access online application form)
 - Must be applied for by **October 29th, 2020**
- **Council/Band/Board resolutions** for each jurisdiction committing project funding*
- **Feasibility Study**
- **Preliminary Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Assessment document**
- **List and status** of required licences, permits and approvals. Indicate if they have been “obtained” or are “pending”
- **Detailed Cost Estimate**
- **Site Plan**

* Note that Council/Band/Board resolution(s) can be submitted up to **1 month** following initial submission

Applications that are given Provincial approval move onto the Federal approval process, which requires a Climate Lens Assessment (this is different from the Preliminary GHG Assessment in the Provincial intake).



Note that costs associated with Climate Lens assessments are considered eligible costs, and will be reimbursed at the appropriate contribution level if the project is federally approved.
